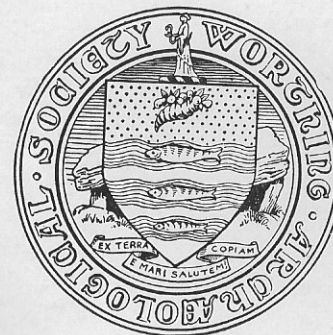

RULES.

1—The Society shall be called the "Worthing Archæological Society."

2—Its objects shall be to promote the study of Archæology in all its branches, and especially the proper recording and preservation of local antiquities, the Worthing Museum being the Headquarters of the Society.

3—Its affairs shall be managed by a President, Honorary Secretary, and Honorary Treasurer, in addition to a Committee of seven members which shall be elected annually. Nominations for any of the offices must be sent to the Honorary Secretary a fortnight before the date of the Annual General Meeting.

4—The Officers shall be a President, Vice-Presidents, Honorary Secretary, and Honorary Treasurer. The President, Honorary Secretary, and Honorary Treasurer, shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting. The Vice-Presidents shall include His Worship the Mayor of Worthing, the Deputy Mayor, the Chairman of the Libraries, Museum, and Art Gallery Committee, and Colonel Margesson.

5—The Annual General Meeting shall be held in March.

6—Candidates for membership must be recommended by two or more members, one of whom must know the candidate personally : elections to take place at Committee Meetings.

7—The Annual Subscription shall be 5/-, with an Entrance Fee of 2/6. All Subscriptions become due on April 1st. Members who are two years in arrears automatically cease membership.

8—Members wishing to resign from membership must notify the Honorary Secretary in writing, otherwise they will be held liable for current Subscriptions.

9—At all ordinary Meetings and Excursions each member is permitted to introduce one visitor, who must obtain a 1/- Meeting Ticket.

10—An Honorary Auditor shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting.

11—Any alterations of the Rules must take place at a General Meeting.

Twenty-second Annual Report for the year ending March 31st, 1944.

The Committee has pleasure in submitting the Annual Report on the work of this Society for the year 1943-44.

Membership. The Society has come through another year with a very satisfactory record and with only a decrease of a dozen in membership which is now 261, 25 of whom have been elected during the year. Eleven members have resigned and twenty, most of whom have left the district, have allowed their membership to lapse.

It is with much regret that the deaths are recorded of six members, three of whom, Dr. Frank Hinds, Mr. J. T. Peers and Mr. A. W. Oke, F.S.A., were original members; also those of Miss A. M. Gough, Miss Pollard, and Mr. S. E. Winbolt, M.A. Mr. Winbolt was a frequent lecturer to the Society in the early days of its existence, and later was elected a life member in recognition of his services to it.

President, Officers and Committee. The President for the year has been Alderman G. B. Bennett, B.A., who during this period, the second in which he has occupied the Presidential Office, has done much to maintain and strengthen the friendly relationships within the Society. The Hon. Treasurer, Miss G. L. Dean, and the Hon. Secretary, Miss E. Gerard, were re-elected to those offices, and Mr. C. T. Speed was elected Hon. Auditor.

Vacancies caused on the Committee by the resignations of Mr. R. B. Francis and Captain Roper, both of whom are on active service, and the Rev. G. D. C. Wheeler, M.A., F.R.E.S., F.Z.S., were filled by the election to it of Mr. J. W. Fox, immediate Past President, Mr. G. Weeks, and Councillor E. R. Willoughby, the other members were re-elected.

Summer Meetings. At the beginning of the year the Committee decided that if arrangements could be made for them, monthly meetings should be held as usual, but so as not to entail strain on any form of transport they should so far as was possible be held in Worthing. Therefore in April through the kind co-operation of C.E.M.A., a lantern lecture entitled "*The Present Rediscovered the Past*," coinciding with a photographic exhibition of that title then on view in the Worthing Museum, was given by Miss Margot Eates of the London Museum, under whose auspices the Exhibition had also been arranged. This practical and extremely interesting lecture was very much appreciated. In May a visit was made to

Chichester Cathedral, where under the guidance of the Rev. R. S. T. Haslehurst, B.D., a most delightful afternoon was spent. Dr. Haslehurst is an authority on the Cathedral and the adjacent buildings and was able to impart many facts not generally known about them. Through his kind offices members were also granted the privilege of visiting certain portions of the Bishop's residence, including the beautiful little private chapel.

In June Mr. J. S. North, of Brighton, gave an illustrated talk entitled "*A Ramble among Sussex Churches*." In July Mr. C. W. Phillips, F.S.A., M.A., who had so much to do with the Sutton Hoo ship burial and its treasures, made a special visit to the Society to lecture on that subject. It was a great privilege to listen to so accomplished a lecturer and the occasion will be remembered as a red-letter one by members who were present.

In August the President and Miss Ashworth most kindly entertained the members to a garden party at "The Warren." It was a beautiful afternoon, the gardens looked their best and the visitors greatly enjoyed the opportunity of making closer contacts with one another.

In September Mr. J. Faulkner broke new ground by his paper on "*Folklore and Weather*."

The President chose for his presidential address in October the subject of the "*Ancient Cities of North Africa*," dealing particularly with those districts through which the victorious Eighth Army had passed so recently. In November Mr. S. H. R. Ghey read a most fascinating paper on "*The work of a parish vestry*," tracing the history of this important parochial institution, and its many but sometimes little known activities, through several centuries.

In December members had the opportunity of hearing the Rev. Dr. Jocelyn Perkins, M.V.O., D.C.L., F.S.A., lecture on "*Life in a Benedictine Monastery*."

The enjoyable and friendly function of the Annual Luncheon took place as usual in January at the Arcade Café and was attended by over sixty members and friends. Unfortunately the after-luncheon speaker, Miss M. Eates, who was to have spoken on "*The Place of Archaeology in the post-war world*" was prevented through illness from being present, but a short symposium on the subject was arranged in which a number of speakers took part, and some very practical suggestions were put forward.

In February Mr. K. Romney Towndrow paid another visit to the Society, this time the subject of his lecture being "*English Church Craftsmanship*," a subject of great interest to many of his hearers and one upon which Mr. Towndrow is an authority.

The Annual Business Meeting is arranged for March and is to be followed by a lantern lecture on "*The story of the Livery Guilds of the City of London*," by Mr. E. P. Angus.

The lectures, with the exception of those held in September and November, have been illustrated by lantern slides, many of exceptional interest. Mr. Francis has been an excellent lanternist. All the lectures have been held in the Lecture Room, Electricity Showrooms, Chapel Road, through the continued kindness of the Electricity and Waterworks Committee.

Excavations. Naturally no excavation work has been done during the year, and only a few isolated finds of small specimens of pottery and bones have been reported from High Down and Waterworks Lane, Broadwater.

Finances. The finances of the Society are in a very satisfactory condition and show a total balance of £78 16s. 5d. Among the donations given during the year was one of five guineas towards the West Tarring Cottages Fund.

Honour to Member. It is with much gratification that record is made of the fact that Councillor E. R. Willoughby, who has been a member of this Society since 1934 and serves upon its Committee, was in November last chosen to fill the Mayoralty of this town. Mrs. Willoughby, the Mayoress, has also been a member since 1934.

Acknowledgments. The Committee desires publicly to record its thanks to Mr. S. H. Ghey, Mr. J. S. North, Mr. C. W. Phillips, M.A., F.S.A., and Mr. K. Romney Towndrow, who very generously gave their lectures without fees; to the President, Alderman G. B. Bennett, B.A., and Miss Ashworth, for their exceptional kindness and hospitality upon the occasion of the garden party; and to the Rev. R. S. T. Haslehurst, B.D., who acted as guide on the occasion of the Chichester meeting.

It desires also to record the indebtedness of the Society to the Electricity and Waterworks Committee of the Town Council for allowing the use of the Lecture Room for the meetings.
